Abstract

This study, commissioned by the London Councils, was developed to investigate and measure a number of factors related to population mobility and transience on London boroughs. Looking at the scale of recent migration and the capital; the existing sources of research into the costs and consequences of population mobility; both the costs and consequences of population mobility and the impacts this generates; and estimates of some of the costs of mobility for boroughs, the study provides a detailed description of some of the service consequences of population movement, as well as the implications for local government finance and evidence about the relationship between transience and social cohesion.
