Abstract : This comprehensive and well-illustrated book includes information on many herbs (woody and herbaceous plants valued for their medicinal and/or aromatic properties) and contains >1500 colour photographs. After a brief introductory description of how to use the book, there are short sections on plant classification, legal restrictions, herb growing through the ages, herbs in myth and legend.

changed the world, herbal books, designing a herb garden, using herbs (culinary, medicinal and cosmetic uses), and herbs in the wild. This last section describes herbs in specific regions of the world, with particular reference to the main threats to the protection of endangered species, progress in conservation, and cultivation. The two main sections of the book are the herb catalogue and the herb dictionary, both of which have entries arranged in alphabetical order of plant genus. The herb catalogue provides botanical descriptions, and details of plant habit, size, hardiness and flowering time. Symbols are used to indicate hardiness, plant parts used, and broad categories of use. The herb dictionary provides information on the parts of the plants used, their properties, and brief details of the specific uses of each plant (culinary, medicinal, aromatic and economic); information is also provided on cultivation and harvesting requirements. Plants are classified as ornamental, crop or wild-collected. Warnings associated with the medicinal use of a species and restrictions on the cultivation of a particular species are indicated in this section of the book. The last part of the book describes cultivation in general: style and site, choosing and planting herbs, herbs in containers, watering, cover, routine garden care, propagation, harvesting, and processing and storage. It also includes a glossary of botanical and medical terms, and an index providing (in addition to botanical names and other entries) cross references for common plant names.
