Abstract

I suppose it would be unseemly in this august body for me to simply Jean over and earnestly share the secret codeword of my profession: SHHHHH. That being done, I could quite simply sit down. That and other stereotypes abound with regard to libraries and librarians. "Why did a nice guy like you leave the ministry?" my family asked when I became a theological librarian at Union in Richmond. On this day of dedication and celebration, I wish to share with you my philosophy- no, better my theology- of librarianship and the role of the library in theological education. Far from having left the ministry, I conceive of my work and that of my staff as a ministry as well as an aid in multiple future ministries. 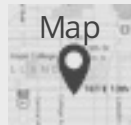
