Abstract

New Hope was a small Mormon agricultural community in Central California founded in 1846, by Samuel Brannan, on the hope that Brigham Young would center stake of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the area. Farmers at New Hope labored diligently under the illusion that other brethren would shortly join them. When President Young decided to move the settlement to the Salt Lake Basin, the New Hope settlement was terminated that same year.
