The study of geographical dimensions of aging has never reached its full potential. The geography of aging has been encouraged in its development through the years by the contributions of geographers such as Graham Rowles, Stephen Golant, Glenda Laws, Mark Rosenberg, and a few others who followed them, such as Gavin Andrews. Yet, only a fraction of the depth and scope of the collected theories, concepts, and methods of geography have been applied to gerontological thinking and research. Relatively few geographers have engaged the problems and opportunities of gerontology, and as a result, only part of geography's power to...
