

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Culture, customs, and traditions of Akwa Ibom people of Nigeria

Chief J. D. Esema born in Akai Ubium, served as a Principal of s Secondary Schools and Teacher Training Colleges for several y before his retirement. In 1972, he was appointed Commission Information, Youth, Sports and Cultural Affairs. It was during be tenure as Commissioner that the rich cultural heritage of the p of the Southern Nigeria ranging from the artifacts to our ancier dance styles were brought to limelight leading to the winning of much coveted GOLD GONG, being the first prize at the first ev competitive National Festival of Arts and Culture held in Kadu Lagos in 1974. In 1974/1975, he was assigned as a National Env Countries of the Horn of Africa, Asia, Australia and the United of America for the World Blacks Festival of Arts and Culture (FESTAC) by the Federal Government of Nigeria

In 1979, Chief Esema was selected the Political Leader of Great Nigeria People's Party (GNPP) and was the governorship candi of the party in the 1979 general elections in the then Cross Rive State of Nigeria. He was the founding father of Farmers Associa of Nigeria and its President for about twenty years. He also serv President of Farmer's Council for three years.

Chief Esema was the State Chairman of the Nigerian Union of Teachers; President (till his death) of the National Palm Product Association of Nigeria; Board Member of the Federal Government Palm Development Board for Six years, and member of the Governing Council of the Cocoa Research Institute of Nigeria (for six years.

At the International level, he served as Director of International Agric-Energy Round Table Inc. since 1985, and he was the Cocoordinator, Pan African Agribusiness Association from 1998 will demise.

In 1995, Chief Esema was elected the Chairman of the Police Community Relations Committee in Akwa Ibom State. He was his death, the Clan Head of Afaha Ubium People, in Nsit Ubiun Local Government Area of Akwa Ibom State.

His other accomplishments and awards include the prestigiou award of WHO IS WHO IN AMERICAN UNIVERSITIES at Linco University, Pennsylvania, U.S.A. He earned several other hono awards (too numerous to list here) in the field of agriculture an citizenship. He was Lay Leader as Divisional Envoy of the Salva Army Church.

Chief J.D. Esema was the Grand Patron of South Eastern State/River State of Nigeria Students' Association in the Americas fro 1981 to 1987.
