Abstract

This study is a history of the schools and educational program maintained by the LDS Church while the saints resided in Ohio and Missouri in the years of 1831 and 1839. The instructors, curriculum, organizational structure, and purpose of each school is given when information in these areas is available. In Kirtland, the Church organized the School of the Prophets, School of the High School, Hebrew School, a singing school, a writing school, and a few others. In Missouri, the Church leaders organized the Colesville School, the Independence, Far West School, and a few others in Caldwell County. The Church activities probably limited the educational pursuits by the members in Missouri.

Church members took advantage of many opportunities to enhance their education, and some of the schools established by Latter-day
