Now in its fourth edition, *Politics of Latin America* explores the current state of the political scene in Latin America. Distinguishing itself from traditional works on the subject, this unique text demonstrates the use and abuse of power and the importance of social context, globalization, and political economy throughout Latin America. The book is composed of thematic chapters that outline the region's geographic, economic, society, gender, race, and religion, setting the stage for an analysis of the politics, democratization, political culture, political revolution in Latin America. The second part of the book consists of constructed case studies of ten representative Latin American countries: Mexico, Cuba, Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Venezuela, Colombia, and Peru.
