

HAZING IN STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS: PREVALENCE, ATTITUDES, AND SOLUTIONS.

Abstract:

This article reports the results of a survey exploring hazing in student organizations. First, a typology of hazing incidents was constructed through factor analysis. Second, respondents reported the prevalence of hazing, and results were compared by type of student organization. Third, respondents indicated their attitudes about hazing, and results were compared between perpetrators of hazing and their victims. Finally, respondents assessed the efficacy of various solutions to hazing compared between those who had perpetrated acts of hazing and those who had not. The results were used to test a theoretical model of hazing behavior on college campuses, with recommendations for solutions.
