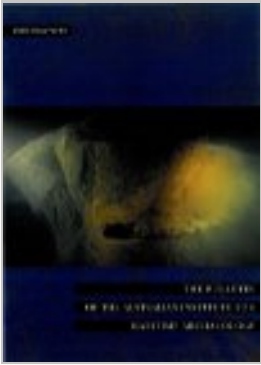

Abstract: This paper builds on a lecture given on the occasion of the Fremantle Submarine Convention held jointly at the Royal Australian Navy Submarine Base HMAS Stirling and the Western Australian Maritime Museum in March 1995. The conference was convened as part of Australia Remembers (1945-1995) to recognise

the fact that over 170 Dutch, British and American submarines made a total of 416 war patrols out of Fremantle between March 1942 and August 1945. Of these submarines 12 were lost, some with all hands (Cairns, 1995).
