When Martin Luther King, Jr., delivered his historic "I have a dream" speech at the March on Washington in 1963, few among the throng knew that it was actually based on an address given by Archibald J. Carey, Jr., at the 1952 Republican National Convention in Chicago. And as King's importance to U.S. history is consistently affirmed, due largely to that speech, not many Americans are familiar with Carey. Dennis C. Dickerson's latest book is poised to change this. It is the first comprehensive study of Archibald J. Carey, Jr., and his father Archibald J. Carey, Sr., two of Chicago's most prominent and influential preacher/politicians whose combined service stretched over most of the twentieth century.

Although the book is in many ways a biography of the two Careys, Dickerson's main concern is to assert the integral connection between African...


