Abstract : This 3-volume work on the biology of insect eggs was at the ear at the time of the death of the author, and the final stages of publication were completed by colleagues. It is the first comprehensive account of all aspects of the insect egg (excluding embryology, since this has been reviewed elsewhere). The work is illustrated with line-drawings and electron micrographs. The first volume contains chapters on aspects of general interest, including egg morphology, enemies

defence mechanisms, parental care of eggs and techniques for obtaining all eggs. In the second volume, the insect orders are considered in separate chapters and their eggs are described and discussed in detail. The third volume contains about 220 pages, a species index, an index to the authors mentioned in the first volume, a subject index and a list of the publications of H. E. Hinton between 1930 and 1952.
