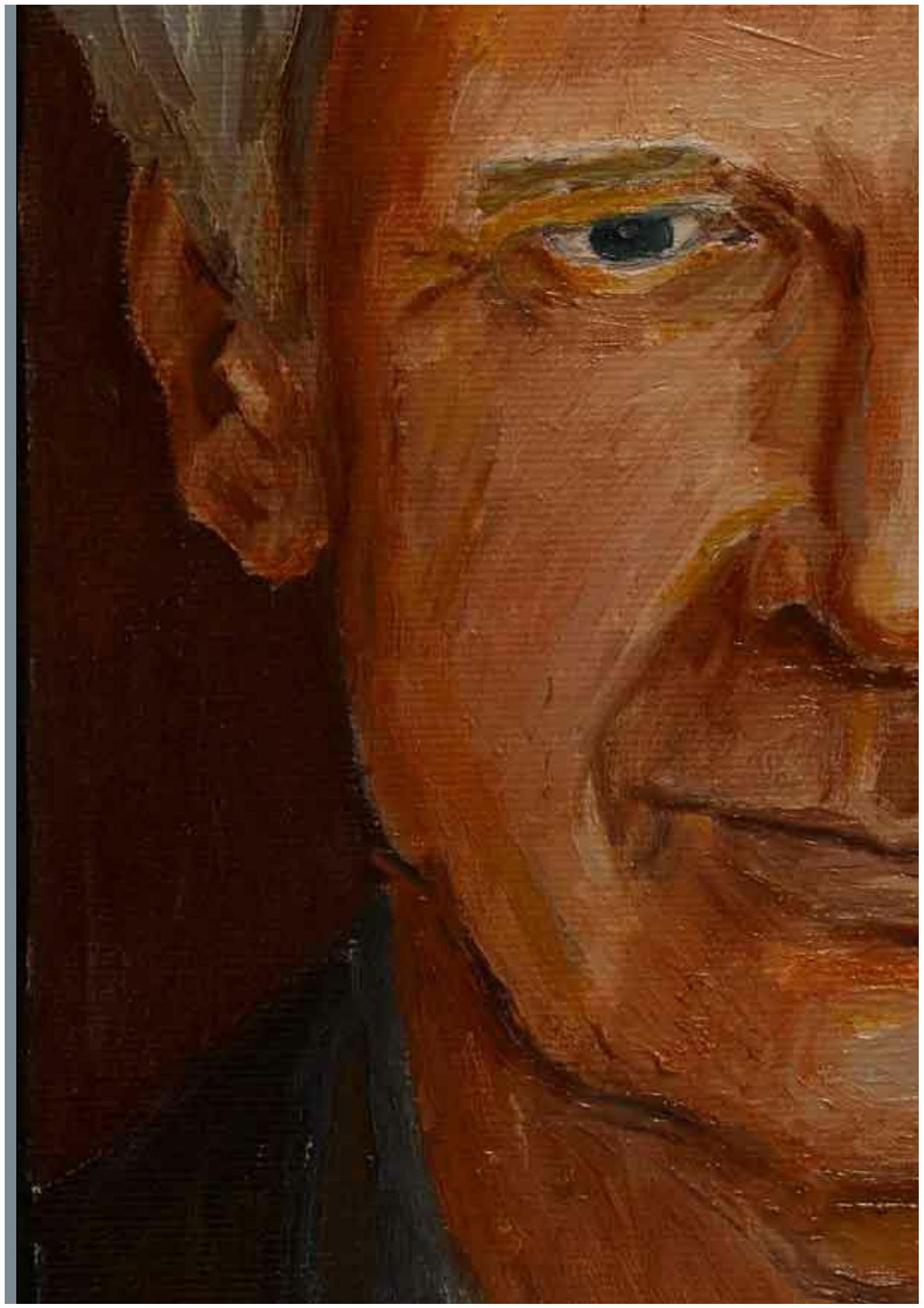

**Harrison Ford** (born July 13, 1942) is an American film actor. He is best known for his roles as Solo in the original *Star Wars* trilogy and the title character in *Patriot Games*. Other notable roles include Rick Deckard in *Blade Runner*, John Book in *Witness*, and Dan in *Dances with Wolves*.

His career has spanned six decades and includes roles in *Innocent*, *The Fugitive*, *Air Force One*, and *What Lies Beneath*. He has also received several awards, including the Golden Globe and Academy Award.<sup>[1]</sup> Five of his films have

In 1997, Ford was ranked No. 1 in *Empire's* "The Top 100 Movie Stars of All Time" list. The total domestic box office grosses of Ford's films total over US\$1 billion, making Ford the third highest grossing U.S. domestic box office star.<sup>[2]</sup> Flockhart

**Early**

Ford was born July 13, 1942, at Chicago, Illinois' Swedish (Nidelman), was a homemaker and former radio actress, and was an advertising executive and a former actor.<sup>[4][5]</sup> A young Ford's grandparents, John Fitzgerald Ford and Florence Veronica Ford, were respectively.<sup>[4]</sup> Ford's maternal grandparents, Harry Nidelman and Minsk, Belarus (at that time a part of the Russian Empire).<sup>[6]</sup> When raised, Ford has jokingly responded, "Democrat,"<sup>[6]</sup> "to be in August 2000, when asked about what influence his Irish Catholic life as a person and as an artist, Ford humorously stated " Jewish.

## Early career

In 1964, Ford traveled to Los Angeles, California to apply for a job at Warner Bros. Pictures in California and eventually signed a \$150 a week contract with the studio to appear in films. His first known part was an uncredited role as a bellboy in The Longest Day. A little record of his non-speaking roles (or "extra" work) in The Longest Day offended producer Jerry Tokovsky after he played a bellboy. Tony Curtis delivered a bag of groceries, he did it like a movie star. He managed to secure other roles in movies, such as A Time for Killing, Hamilton and The

His speaking roles continued next with Luv (1967), though he was credited as "J. Ford" in the 1967 Western film, A Time for Killing, but the name was changed to avoid confusion with a silent film actor. He appeared in films between 1915 and 1932, and died in 1957. Ford later worked for Harrison Ford until he came upon a star with his own name. He worked as "J" and worked for Universal Studios, playing minor roles in the 1970s, including Gunsmoke, Ironside, The Virginian, The F.B.I., and the western Journey to Shiloh (1968) and had an uncredited, minor role in Zabriskie Point, as an arrested student protester. Not happy with his job, he taught professional carpenter<sup>[8]</sup> to support his then-wife and worked as a stagehand for the popular rock band The Doors. He also built a recording studio for Brazilian band

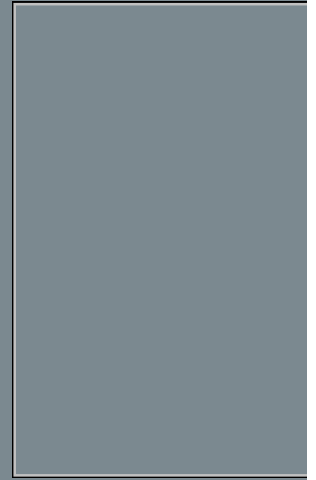
He was then hired to build cabinets at the home of director Francis Ford Coppola in a supporting role for his film American Graffiti (1973).<sup>[8]</sup> Ford's career later on. After director Francis Ford Coppola's film The Godfather in his office and gave him small roles in his next two films, The Conversation and The Godfather Part II. 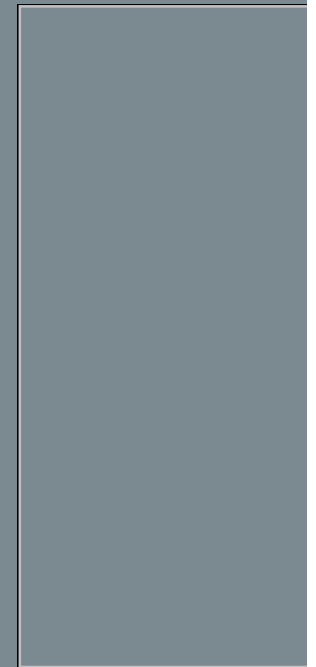
## Star Wars

Ford's carpentry work eventually landed him his first starring role for actors auditioning for parts in his *Star Wars* (1977). Lucas cast him as Han Solo.<sup>[12]</sup> *Star Wars* became one of the most successful films as a superstar.<sup>[8]</sup> He went on to star in the similarly-successful *Return of the Jedi* (1983), as well as *The Star Wars Holiday Special*.<sup>[8]</sup> Ford declined the offer of either sequel, saying, "That would have given me the

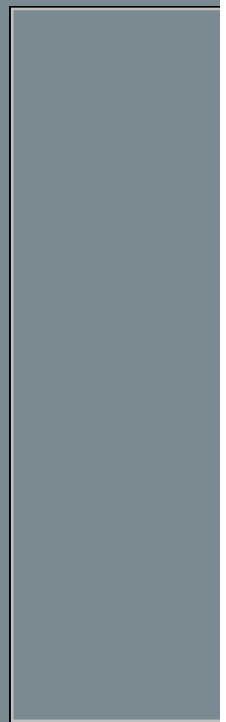

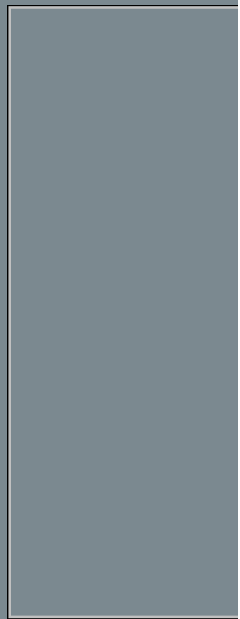
Starting in the late 1990s, Ford appeared in several critical successes, including *Six Days Seven Nights* (1998), *Random Hearts* (1999), *Crash* (2003), *Firewall* (2006), and *Extraordinary Measures* (2010). <sup>[16]</sup>

over \$155 million in the United States.

In 2004, Ford declined a chance to star in the thriller *Syriana* about the truth of the material and I think I made a mistake. He won an Oscar and a Golden Globe for his work. Prior to the film's release, Ford had a supporting written role, Robert Wakefield in *Traffic*.

In 2008, Ford enjoyed success with the release of *Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom*, a collaboration between George Lucas and Steven Spielberg. The film was the second highest-grossing film worldwide in 2008.<sup>[17]</sup> He later announced that he would take another 20 years off from acting.

Other 2008 work included *Crossing Over*, directed by Wayne Kramer, in which Ford was working alongside Ashley Judd and Ray Liotta.<sup>[19][20]</sup> He also appeared in the film *Lama* entitled *Dalai Lama*.

He has expressed interest in returning to directing.

In July 2011, Ford starred alongside Daniel Craig and Olivia Wilde in the film *Anonymous*.

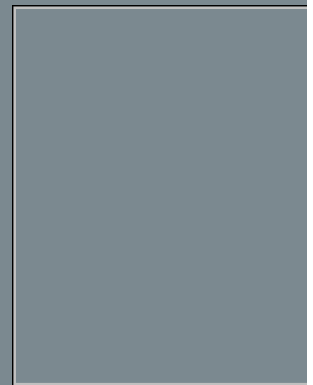

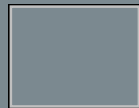

Ford sits on the board of directors of Conservation International and has received the Nature Award for his ongoing work.

In 1993, the arachnologist Norman Platnick named a new species of spider. In 1994, the entomologist Edward O. Wilson named a new ant species Pheidole.

Ford is the Vice Chairman of Conservation International.

Since 1992, Ford has lent his voice to a series of public service announcements, including EarthShare, an American federation of environmental organizations.

**Political**

Like his parents, Ford is a lifelong Democrat,<sup>[57]</sup> and has been a vocal supporter of the Tibet.

On September 7, 1995, Ford testified before the U.S. Senate and an independent Tibet, and was banned thereafter from entering China.<sup>[58][59]</sup> In 2008, he narrated the documentary The Tibetan People.

In 2003, he publicly condemned the Iraq War and called for an end to the war. He criticized Hollywood for making violent movies, and called for more government regulation of the film industry. He also criticized California Governor Gray Davis, and stated in an interview that the war in Iraq would be a mistake.

**Archaeology**

Following on his success portraying the archaeologist Indiana Jones, Ford has become a professional archaeologist. He serves as a General Trustee of the American Institute of Archaeology (AIA), North America's oldest and largest organization dedicated to the study of ancient cultures. He has helped them in their mission of increasing public awareness of archaeology and the importance of protecting our cultural heritage.

**Community**

Ford volunteered as a food server. On November 21, 2007, Ford and Calista Flockhart, helped serve hot meals to the homeless at the San Francisco Mission.

**Awards**

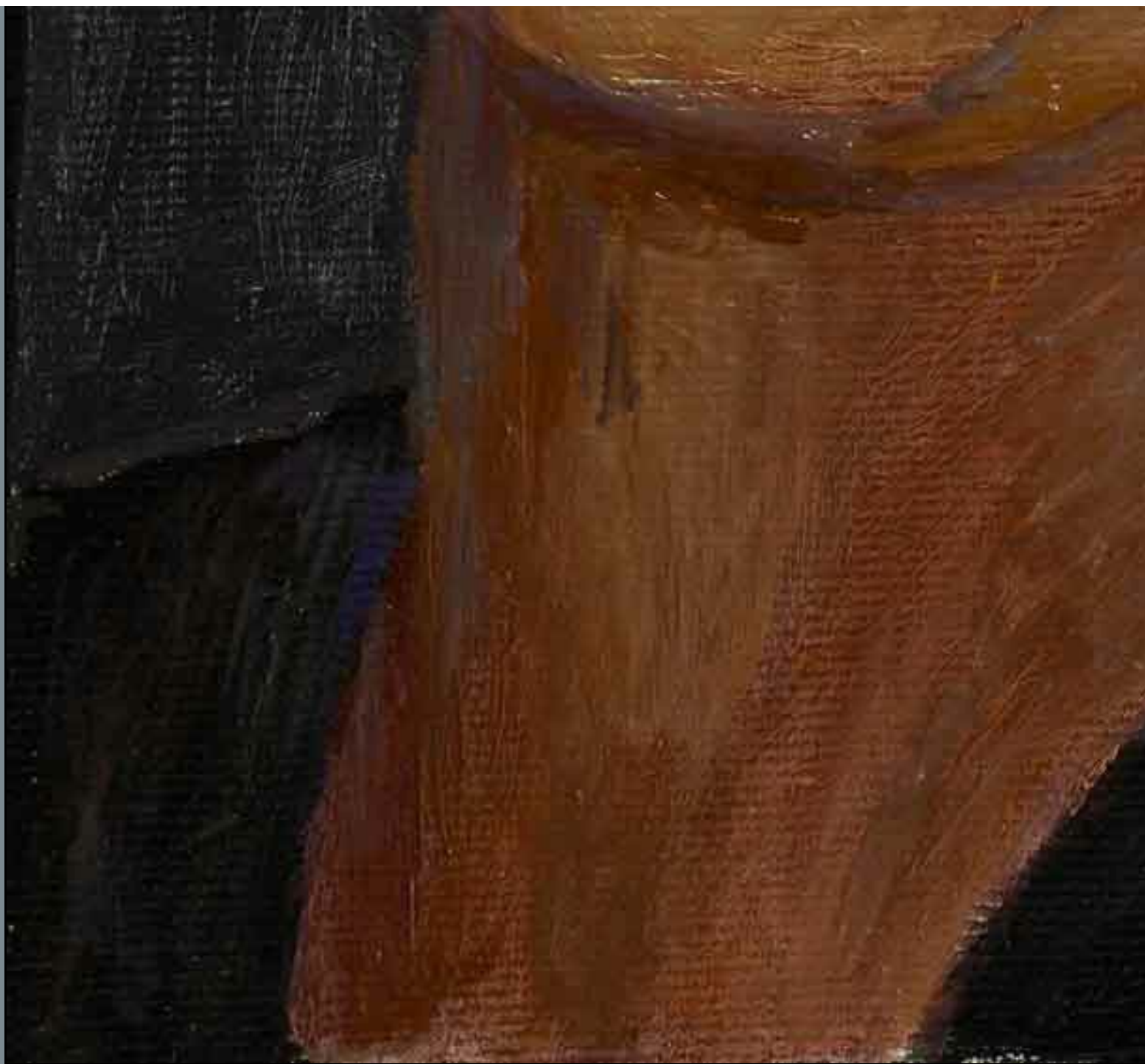

**Jane Fonda** (born **Lady Jayne Seymour Fonda**; December 16, 1937) is an American actress, former [fashion model](#), and [fitness guru](#). She rose to fame in the 1960s and 1970s. She has won two [Academy Awards](#), an [Emmy Award](#) and received more than 50 years

After 15 years of retirement, she returned to film in 2005 with *The Day After Tomorrow*. She also produced and starred in over 20 exercise videos for the fitness brand *Body by Jay*.

Fonda has been an activist for many political causes; her opinions on the *Iraq War* were controversial. She has also protested the *Iraq War* and violence against women. In 2005, Fonda worked alongside *Robin Morgan* and *Wendie Small* to create an organization that works to amplify the voices of women through education, training, and the creation of original content. Fonda currently lives in Los Angeles. Fonda has been a *Christian*. She published an autobiography, *Prime Time Live*.

## Family background

Lady Jayne Seymour Fonda was born in New York City, the daughter of the socialite *Frances Ford Seymour Brokaw*. Fonda's surname is of *English* descent.<sup>[1]</sup> She was named after the third wife of *Ernest Borgnine*, a distantly related on her mother's side.<sup>[2]</sup> Her brother, *Peter Fonda*, and her father are actors. Fonda had a maternal half-sister, *Frances Foy*, who committed *suicide* while under treatment at a psychiatric hospital. Fonda has a son, *Susan Blanchard* (born 1928), nine years his daughter.

At age 15, Fonda taught dance at *Fire Island Pines, New York*, *York*, and *Vassar College* in *Poughkeepsie*, but dropped out of college to pursue the cover of *Time* magazine.

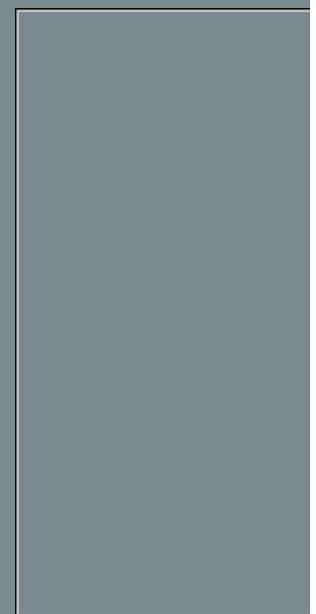

The show, which contained strong, frank criticism of the war by s

On May 4, 1970, Fonda appeared before an assembly at the University of California, Berkeley, to discuss the rights and issues. The end of her presentation was met with a riot. The poet, Gregory Corso staggered onto the stage. Drunk, Corso called out to Fonda and she addressed the shooting of four students at Kent State. Fonda in her autobiography revisited the incident: "I was shocked and she then immediately joined a protest march on the home front. The marchers chanted themselves "They Shoot Students, Don't They?"—a reference to the fact that she had just had a run in

In the same year, Fonda spoke out against the war at a rally in Valley Forge, Pennsylvania. I want to apologize to them and their families. [...] I will go to my grave with the anti-aircraft gun, which looks like I was trying to shoot at American planes. That was the most horrible thing I could possibly do.

Critics pointed out that her apology came at a time when she was trying to disrupt a film project she was working on, leading to the perception that it was a self-interested move.

In a *60 Minutes* interview on March 31, 2005, Fonda reiterated her regret over the photo taken in 1972, with the exception of the anti-aircraft gun photo. She said, "I regret the forces and of the 'country that gave me privilege'. Fonda said, "My daughter ... sitting on an enemy aircraft gun was a betrayal. She later distinguished between regret over the use of her gun and her actions. "There are hundreds of American delegations that had no idea of the propaganda... It's not something that I will apologize for." She also mentioned a photo she made on Radio Hanoi, something she asked the North Vietnamese to show. "They were dying because of it, and I felt I had to do anything to

Fonda's autobiography was well received by book critics, and *Time* magazine called it "Fonda herself" in its Washington Post review, pronouncing it "one of the best autobiographies of the year."

The York Times called the book "a masterpiece."

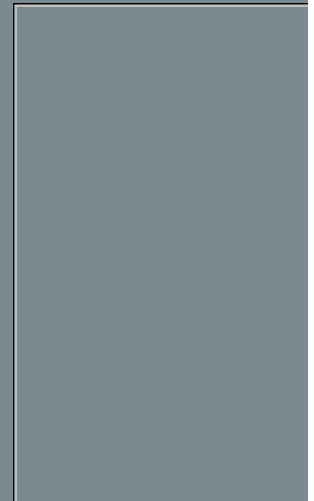

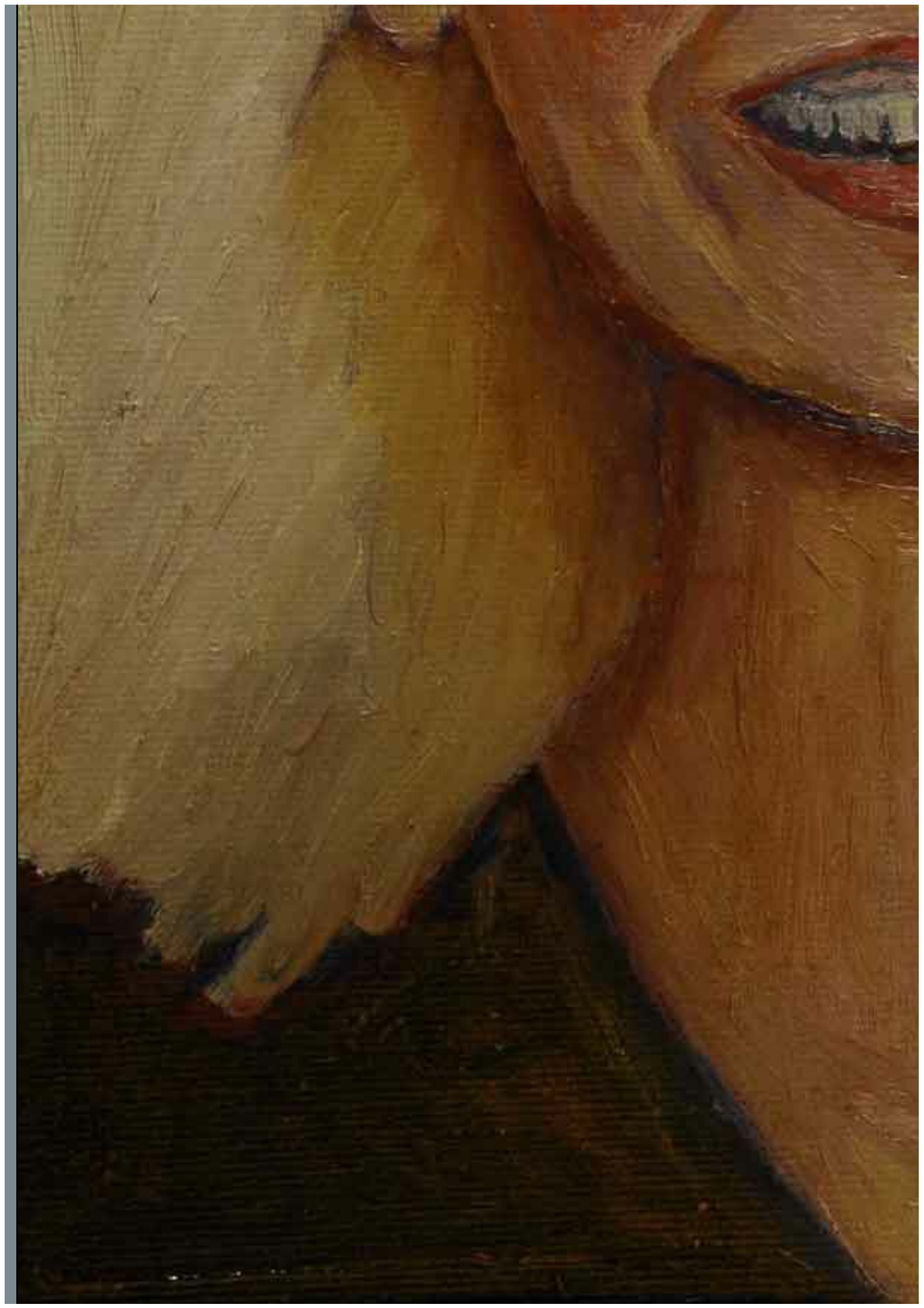
