The Craft Reader, edited by Adamson, was praised by Barry S. 'kaleidoscopic mix of materials', 'put[ting] just enough order down.' Covering the period from the early 19th century to the commissioned writings. The anthology is organised chronologically such as craft's putative opposition to industry; the revival and theorisations of craft's relations to fine art.

Another novel feature of the anthology is its geographical and historical range. Gropius and William Morris are represented, The Craft Reader considers unexpected contexts in Europe and America (such as the Arts and Crafts movement). In addition to these well-known figures, this selection, the book greatly expands the frame of reference. The texts were selected by Adamson from books, magazines, and online sources. This required an intensive period of research and reading. Adamson wrote long introductory essays for each section of the book. Unlike most scholarly anthologies, The Craft Reader is more concerned with the practical applications of theory than with a detailed conceptual and historical structure for this emerging field of study. The book is intended for a large readership among practitioners and students, and general readers interested in the history of Modern Painters, Art in America, and Crafts, and in scholarly and critical approaches to Craft Research.
