

Disability and employment: Considering the importance of social capital.

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Abstract:

In addressing the high rate of unemployment among persons with a disability, job programs focus on making job building prospective employees' human capital, but tend to overlook causes of unemployment rooted in the mismatch employees with jobs. Social capital in the form of social networks is known to be important to the employment of persons without a disability, and is probably also important among persons with a disability. The impact of social capital on employment chances, along with the prospect that persons with specific types of disability may have less effective employment opportunities, may account for some portion of the unemployment rate among persons with a disability. Could employment programs be building the social capital of persons with a disability? Vocational rehabilitation counselors should consider social capital in any employment strategy. Strategies for building social capital are discussed.
