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How to pull strings with words: Deceptive violations in the garden-path joke

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Abstract

In a deceptive joke called the "garden-path joke" it is occasionally the case that Grice's maxims of conversation are uncooperatively violated. Such violations might point to a commonly accepted notion that jokes form an uncooperative discourse. But a close analysis reveals that there is a certain regularity, which indicates the cooperative aspect of a joke: That is, while the character(s) in the garden-path joke can freely violate the maxims of conversation for the sake of the joke's essential ambiguity, the narrator may avoid violating the maxims. The aim of this paper is to bring out this regularity by giving evidence for the "Character-Did-It" Hypothesis.
