



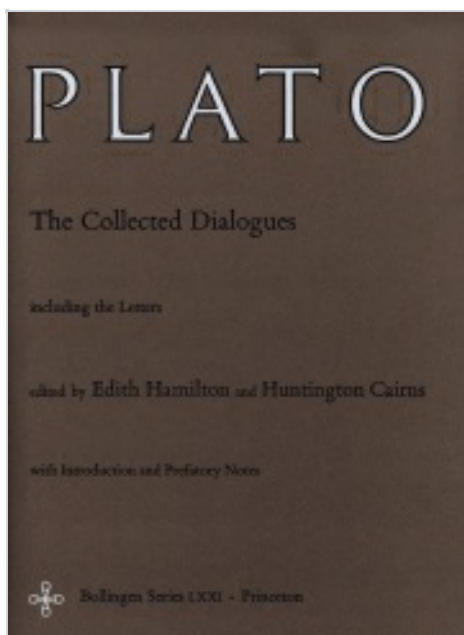

**SUMMARY**
